Dear friends,

Sunshine and daylight savings, blossom and birdsong – springtime is well and truly upon us and I hope you are finding ways to enjoy the regeneration and new opportunities it brings!



The revitalisation of our floral life and the return of sunlight to many of our days, mirror in part the change in seasons in the Church year as we move from the more introspective season of Lent to a more obviously light-filled season, punctuated by the celebration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead, His ascension to heaven and the coming of His Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Each of these events is significant in and of itself.

First, in Jesus' physical resurrection from the dead we are shown that death is not the end of our lives: that life after death is possible. Secondly, in Jesus' ascension we see more clearly Jesus' divine origins as He returns to His Father in dramatic fashion in full view of His first followers.

Thirdly, in the coming of the Spirit at Pentecost we see God promising to dwell with His people in a powerful, personal and lasting way.

Each of these events is significant in and of itself, but together they paint a portrait of a God who is powerful (even stronger than death), a God who intervened in human history (in the person of His Son) and a God who remains present with His people (by His Spirit). These are just some of the reasons the Christian Church rejoices greatly at this time and in this season. 

May 9th

The Deanery choir will be supporting the Deanery service at St Mary's Church, Great Bentley CO7 8QG at 7.00pm. This has been at the request of Laurie Bond and will bring together all the churches in the diocese.

May 12th

The Deanery choir will be singing at St George's Church, Great Bromley CO7 7HZ at the 11.00am communion service. The choir will sing 'Give almes of thy goods by Christopher Tye'. Christopher Tye is believed to have been born in Cambridge, England.

The first references to Christopher Tye are when he attended and received his Bachelor of Music degree in Cambridge in the year 1536. The next year, in 1537, he took up a position as a lay clerk at King's College. Based on recorded financial records we know that by 1543 he took up a more prestigious position as the Magister Choristarum at Ely Cathedral with an annual salary of ten English pounds. Shortly, thereafter, in 1545 the University of Cambridge saw fit to bestow upon Tye the degree of Doctor of Music. May 26th

THE WEAVER


My life is but a weaving Between my God and me. I cannot choose the colours He weaveth steadily.

The Crucifixion

Following on from last month's article on Passiontide and the Road to Calvary we are going to move on to look at depictions of Jesus' Crucifixion, in our local churches. Although crosses in Churches are universal, depictions of the Crucifixion itself are much less frequently seen in Anglican Churches.

In St. Mary's Church Dedham, the only one to be found, is in a window at the west end of the south aisle, which shows, "Caritas" (Charity), "Fides" (Faith) and "Spes" (Hope). The central figure 'Faith' is holding a small Crucifix. To find larger and more detailed depictions of the Crucifixion, we have to leave Dedham Church.

The charming little Churches of St Mary in Wix and St. Leonard and St. Mary in Beaumont cum Moze, two of our nine associated churches, both have stained-glass windows showing the Crucifixion.

In Wix there are only three panels of stained glass

which are situated behind the altar. Seven had been intended but insufficient funds were raised when a major restoration was undertaken in the late 19th century. In the central panel, Christ

hangs on the cross and standing at either side are Mary, his mother, and St. John.

Likewise, behind the altar in Beaumont cum Moze, another window shows the Crucifixion in the central panel. In this a soldier in armour kneels before Jesus possibly representing the moment when the Roman centurion, experiencing the darkness and the earthquake which accompanied Jesus' Crucifixion and death, looks up in awe and realises "Surely He was the Son of God" (Matthew 27: 54).

We are also fortunate to have nearby, the lovely sister church of St. Mary's Ardleigh, which has not a stained-glass window but a mural, depicting the Crucifixion. Here his mother, Mary, and Mary Magdalene, beautifully robed, stand on either side. This striking mural looks down, from above the arched entrance to the nave.

These representations show above Jesus' head the letters INRI, in Latin 'lesus Nazarenus, Rex ludaeorum', meaning ''Jesus the Nazarene, King of the Jews," which Pontius Pilate had deliberately placed there. (John 19: 19 – 22)

Perhaps an acknowledgement that he realised that Jesus really was the new King of the Jews, though failing to realise that Jesus would, through His death and resurrection, become King of all Peoples.

It is very hard to comprehend, let alone convey, in stained glass or paint the suffering of someone undergoing the dreadful death by Crucifixion.

Church depictions often offer a rather sanitised version with beautifully dressed Saints standing on either side of a very "clean" looking Jesus, as exemplified in the Ardleigh mural.


We hear in St. John's gospel (19:28-30) that Jesus' lips were moistened with "wine vinegar" because He was thirsty, which might seem like further torture, but was in fact a small act of kindness amidst the cruelty." Sour wine" (rather than what we think of today as vinegar) was in biblical times taken as a refreshing drink.

In his agony Jesus called out to his Father," My God,my God, why have you forsaken me ?" (Matthew 27:46) but did not spare himself this cruel death. The Bible tells us that it was for us he hung and suffered there.

Next month we shall return to Dedham Church for the depiction of the joyous realisation of Jesus' triumphant resurrection.



DEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL REPORT FROM THE MEETING ON 8th APRIL 2024

The meeting recorded its thanks to Cllr Sandra Williams & Cllr Jonathan Smith for their work on behalf of Dedham Parish Council as both councillors would be stepping down at the next election.

Parish Council Elections

It was noted that there were I I candidates standing for 9 places for the Parish Council with the election taking place on Thursday 2^{nd} May.

National Grid and Pylons

It was noted that the latest consultation on the National Grid pylons plan will be shortly published and it was agreed the Council will need to submit a response in dialogue with the local campaigning group.

Business Breakfast

This was noted to have been a valuable event and it was noted there were some new businesses in attendance.

Planning

The Parish Council welcomed the local authority decisions regarding Petalo Lodge. A number of other planning applications were discussed, and comments made on the proposals. The Council noted that in its present form it could not support the proposed development plans for Trinity House on Long Road East. The Council also noted that it continued to oppose the change of usage of Shakespeare House in the High Street from retail to residential. The Council had no objections to other proposals submitted.

Highways

It was noted that Essex Police want to use Dedham in a pilot scheme looking at traffic problems. It was also noted that there continued to be problems with speeding through the village and to help address this 30mph stickers have been ordered that people could put outside their properties. It was also noted that the 30 mph sign in Brook Street had been knocked down and it was agreed to recommend to Essex Highways to address this.

Dedham Fun Run

It was noted that this will be on Sunday 15th September 2024 and Council agreed that the Playing Fields could be made use of for the conclusion of the run.

LOCAL ELECTIONS


On Thursday 2nd May 2024 a combination of local elections will take place in Colchester. There will be elections for:

Colchester City Council, the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner for Essex and some Parishes also have elections, that may be contested.

There is one Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner for the whole of Essex.

Across all 17 city wards in Colchester, one of the three ward councillor seats will be up for election in May 2024 as the city elects by thirds.

The Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner election ballot paper will be lilac. The city election ballot paper will be white.

TOWARDS A GREENER DEDHAM

How we travel can have a big impact on our own experiences of the journey and the environment around us. Here at Greener Dedham, a group of local residents keen to share ways for us all to become more mindful of our consumption through travel, we have developed a few helpful tips to help you reduce carbon emissions (and costs, too!):

I. Choosing to walk and cycle more – here in Dedham, we are incredibly fortunate to have such a rich array of footpaths and cycle paths that link to the local areas around us (such as Manningtree and Flatford). Travelling by foot or bicycle can really help to save on fuel and cut down on emissions at the same time.

2. Switch to LED light bulbs – LED lights use a lot less electricity, so are a fantastic investment for the purse-strings. They help the environment by requiring less carbon emissions to be produced to run them, too.

3. Reduce your air travel – consider alternatives to travelling, such as by train or by boat. These alternatives also often offer opportunities to take in beautiful scenery along the way, and the ability to stop at multiple destinations along the way, too.

Gardening Notes

FERNERY FINERY

May is a great time to enjoy the sight of fresh green fronds unfurling as ferns put on their new growth. If you have a shadier corner and you're not sure what to do with it, why not give them a go instead of shrubs or flowering perennials?

You can always add a pop of colour at this time of year by planting alliums among them. A fine-looking, but lowmaintenance option, they need little more than a quick tidy up to remove dead and dying fronds in spring to clear the way for fresh new growth.



Fernery

Your fernery doesn't need to be perpetually damp (though a wider range of ferns enjoy this kind of ground) and there are several ferns that will suit drier shade close to a hedge or trees: (Dryopteris – there's even a clue in the name). The small, delicate maidenhair, Adiantum venustum, likes a sheltered spot, while the shuttlecock or ostrich fern Matteuccia struthiopteris reaches I.5 metres when given its preferred moist conditions.

Ferns come in varying shades of green of course, but your fernery could also include the silver-and-burgundyflushed Athyrium niponicum or the 'autumn fern', Dryopteris erythrosora, which has red new growth that gradually turns bronze.

Now, while all this looks lovely in a certain garden I know, unfortunately very little of my garden is given over to ferns and there's plenty to be getting on with if I'm going to stay on top of it all.



Clematis

The borders are getting into their stride now with peonies surrounded by froths of sky-blue forget-me-nots. The early bulbs are mostly over now (feed them as they die back for a better show next season), but the violet globes of Allium hollandicum 'Purple Sensation' are taking over, reaching up to meet amethyst racemes of Wisteria sinensis.

Delphiniums are giving the deepest blue, purple and ultramarine spires, but will need careful staking if their heavy heads aren't to snap straight off.

I put my tomato plants out towards the end of May as the danger of frost passes. I plant them deeply so some of the stem is also buried. New roots will

grow from this, resulting in a stronger plant that will stand up better to the weight of the fruit. Tomatoes are great fresh off the vine, but also make a fantastic 'red and green' chutney – look out for it entered in our September show (or have a go yourself!).



I've a couple of hostas filling their pots and as the leaves start to put their pointed tips above soil-level, it's a good time to divide them. Just tip them out and saw through the tightly packed root system, – a bit harsh but they'll thank you for it later. Similarly rootbound agapanthus enjoy being be tightly packed, but it's worth moving them into a pot one size bigger every three years or so. I'll also go round the garden splitting larger clumps of Primula vulgaris and replanting them to fill gaps in other beds and borders.

If you've gaps to fill in your garden too, then pop along to the front of Dedham Church on Saturday 11th May for our annual plant sale from 9-11.30am.



Peonies

You can pick up some bargains and we'd love to take off your hands anything from the garden that you no longer need. But if plants aren't your thing, Mission Bake might be able to tempt you along with their homemade cakes.

Our final speaker evening at 7.30pm on Wednesday 5th June will welcome local gardener Ed Fairey who will talk to us about the History of the National Garden Scheme with a particular focus on Essex gardens. Entry is just £2 for non-members and it's a great way to get to know more about us.


Norwich to Tilbury

National Grid Norwich to Tilbury – Statutory consultation 10th April to 18th June 2024.

The statutory consultation for the Norwich to Tilbury pylons and undergrounding project commenced on 10th April (2024) with a deadline for responses of 18th June 2024.

The plans are, as expected, a lot more damaging to the local area than the original high level swathe maps depicted with; access roads through small villages, acres of construction compounds, cable pull areas sprawling out and country roads being widened to accommodate massive transport / construction machinery.

This is what is planned across the Dedham Vale National Landscape (Formally AONB)






